- The Bible is both human and divine.
- The Bible contains the very words of God.
- Pastors and teachers must believe and teach sound Christian doctrine.
- It is one thing to affirm that the Bible claims to be the words of God. It is another thing to be convinced that those claims are true. (*Attributed to J. Gresham Machen*)

- What is it that allows some to be impacted by the words of Scripture, while others see it as an interesting book at best and nothing else?
- How would you respond to someone who claimed that Jesus was a "good teacher" who ended as a crucified peasant from 1<sup>st</sup> Century Nazareth?
- How do you define "God-breathed?" How is this tracked back to Adam?
- Discuss the 4 purposes of Scripture:
  - Purpose #1 Teaching
  - Purpose #2 Reproof
  - Purpose #3 Correction
  - Purpose #4 Training
